FOREST ORDER

USDA FOREST SERVICE PIKE-SAN ISABEL NATIONAL FORESTS & CIMARRON AND COMANCHE NATIONAL GRASSLANDS Pikes Peak Ranger District

Area, Road, and Trail Closure

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the National Forest System (NFS) lands, roads, and trails within the Pikes Peak Ranger District, Pike-San Isabel National Forests & Cimarron and Comanche National Grasslands, described below and shown on the attached map incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A (the "Described Area" and "Described Roads and Trails").

The Described Area is located southwest of Monument, Colorado and Monument Rock in Sections 20 and 21, Township 11 South, Range 67 West, 6th P.M. The Described Area is bounded by NFR 320, Mount Herman Road, on the west, Nursery Road on the north, and the forest boundary on the east and south. The Described Roads and Trails are all roads and trails within the Described Area: NFS Trail 715, Monument Trail.

This Order is necessary to protect public health and safety during vegetation management operations.

PROHIBITIONS:

- 1. Going into or being in the Described Area. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e).
- 2. Being on the Described Roads and Trails. 36 C.F.R. §§ 261.54(e), 261.55(a)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order) specifically exempting them from this Order.
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force, in the performance of an official duty.

This Order shall be in effect from May 16, 2022, to June 27, 2022, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

A violation of the above prohibitions is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, 3581
